Passport Report

Last week, our youth attended Passport Camp at Greensboro College along with over 300 youth and chaperones from multiple states. The overall camp theme was Big and the daily themes we explored in Bible study were: Big God, Big Faith, Big Community, and Big Impact. Each morning, the youth participated in a Bible study before attending a different rotation in the afternoon. These rotations included worship leadership, missions education, and mission projects.

During the worship leadership, the youth were given an opportunity to learn different ways to participate in leading worship. One youth participated in a group that led a song during worship. Three youth learned an interpretive movement and performed during the worship service. Two youth participated by creating a piece of art representing the camp theme that was displayed during the worship service.

The missions education rotation allowed youth to participate in a poverty simulation. Youth were divided into groups that had to navigate housing, job security, enrolling in school, getting an ID and paying hospital bills. Several of the groups represented immigrants and refugees. This experience was incredibly enlightening and demonstrated that we don't often know what people are dealing with in their lives. It also highlighted the importance of access to education especially for families whose lives have been turned upside down by change. It also connected with the mission offering this year. Passport's offering supports three different ministries that aim to provide aid for families and access to education in difficult circumstances. The three ministries were Project Ruth in Romania that provides education for Roma children and has now expanded their ministry to include Ukrainian refuges, Africa Exchange that works to provide access to education for children in rural communities in Africa, and Together for Hope: Appalachia a CBF ministry that is present in poverty-stricken areas to provide relief and assistance. The campers raised over \$4,000 toward the mission offering during our week of camp.

The last two days we served at a local ministry called Backpack Beginnings. This is a non-profit ministry that seeks to provide food, clothing, and care for children in Greensboro and the surrounding area. One of the projects is the backpack ministry to feed children on the weekends during the school year and summers. Our youth packed food for their different distribution ministries on Wednesday and then sorted through clothing for their clothing pantry on Thursday. The campers were able to accomplish a great deal over the two days that they were at Backpack Beginnings that will provide much needed help for families in need.

This week had a big impact on our youth, and I look forward to them sharing about their experiences at camp with you during out Youth Sunday service on August 21.
