

Growing Together – This past Sunday, we began to consider the second question on our journey of growing together: "Where do I fit?" Fitting in and being accepted are things we all desire. We can deny it, but we all want and need to fit in. Finding a place to fit in is one of the great struggles in all stages of life from childhood to senior adulthood. Sometimes our identity, tarnished by sin, makes us think that we don't fit in

and that no one wants us. Feeling that you don't fit in and aren't accepted, leads to despair, depression, and desperate attempts to fit in. In John 4, Jesus talked to a woman who had a hard time fitting in and offered her a place in His kingdom.

Jesus met a Samaritan woman at Jacob's well who didn't fit in, but He offered her "living water" and a fit in God's kingdom (cf., Jn 4:4-42). Jesus was on His way from the area of Jerusalem back north to Galilee. Normally, a Jew would not travel through Samaria even though it was the most direct route. Samaritans, who were only partly Jewish, were considered outcasts. They didn't fit in with Jews, but Jesus, who came for everyone, took the road less traveled and offered this woman a fit in God's kingdom.

She had four reasons not to fit in with Jesus. First, she was a Samaritan, and Jesus was a Jew. Even though they came from different backgrounds, Jesus offered her "a spring of water welling up to eternal life." Second, she didn't fit in because she was imperfect with many past failures. She had had five husbands and lived with a sixth man who was not her husband. Still, Jesus offered her forgiveness and "living water." Third, she and Jesus worshiped in different places—she on Mt Gerizim and Jesus in Jerusalem. However, Jesus told her that they must worship the same God together in "spirit and truth." Fourth, the disciples were shocked to find Jesus talking with a Samaritan woman. Their shock and looks of contempt were certainly evident. However, the Samaritan woman didn't take their looks to heart. She listened to Jesus and went to find her friends in the town. Soon, not only did she find her fit in God's kingdom, but many others did also. They found their fit by receiving the invitation of Messiah Jesus to drink His living water of eternal life.

How about you? Have you found your fit with Jesus? Maybe you say, "I'm not like you," but you are. We have all been made in God's image and likeness. Maybe you say, "I'm not perfect enough for God." Jesus will forgive and accept you. Maybe you say, "I've never been a part of a church before," but you can be a member of the kingdom of God of which Abingdon Baptist is a part. Maybe others have told you that you don't fit or have made you feel that way. Jesus says, "You fit." We can find reasons not to fit, but Jesus says, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." (Mt 11:28) Whoever you are; wherever you're from; whatever you've done; No matter what others say; Jesus says, "Come drink from this spring of living water that wells up in you to eternal life." Finding your real fit in life begins by fitting in with Jesus. He will help you find your fit. He accepts you.
