

Panama Mission Breakfast – Rescheduled for Sunday, January 26 at 9am in Fellowship Hall. Due to the winter storm and the cancelation of in-person participation last Sunday, we have rescheduled this breakfast. It will be prepared by the Odds & Ends Sunday School class in support of our Panama Mission Trip. We are still short of our funding goal for this trip, and we need your help. This breakfast is on a donation basis, and all donations received will be used to support our team as they go ON MISSION to Panama March 9-15, 2025.

The Faith in Action Food Pantry provided free food 8,727 times with 567 new families enrolling. Food purchases were \$24,730.86. These purchases along with USDA and donated food allowed the Food Pantry to provide over \$1 million in free food in 2024. Thank you for your donation of items during the 2024 year.
